Minutes

May 15, 2008

The CLHS Active Parents Group met on Thursday, May 15, 2008. Those in attendance were: Karen Miller, Kathy Irwin, Denise Crider, Christine Hollingsworth, Christy Cook, Stephanie Horn, Tricia Dusheke, Terri Peters, Sandy Propst, executive director John Engelbrecht and principal Erich Ahlers. The meeting opened with prayer.

The current total for the Flower Sale profits is approximately \$3,600. Thanks to all of the parents, students, and other volunteers that helped with the event. It was a big success.

For the bylaw amendment vote, ballots were passed out to all and nominations were voted on and agreed to by all to except this change. The bylaw amendment was passed. A copy of the new bylaws will be posted on the CLHS website.

Per the bylaws, nominations and elections were made for the officers of the CLHS Booster Association (*formally known as Active Parent Group*). The following executive officers were elected:

Meetings for June and July will be held by members of the Executive Committee only. A general meeting to include all parents and/or any other participants who would like to attend will be held in August.

Terri Peters indicated the Calvary Student Council held a dance at Trinity for 6-8th grades with 253 students attending and this brought in a profit of \$1,350. 50% of this money will pay the price of logos for letter jackets. The rest will be used as seed money for student council to hold a possible dance next year. Terri thanked everyone who made this event a success.

Denise Crider passed out the Treasurer's report to everyone. The financial items were discussed and approved as presented.

Tricia Dusheke discussed the Athletic BBQ set for July 26th at Schulte's. Proceeds will be used for baseball uniforms. Mr. Ahlers and others discussed selling tickets and decided this was not a good idea but would do deliveries if requested. We need to pass out flyers to fire stations, car dealerships and others who work on Saturday's who may want to place large orders for a delivery that day.

Denise Crider passed out the Fundraising Committee budget sheet and went over all figures.

On May 20th the Recognition Award Assembly will be at McClung Park beginning with the meal at 5:30. The Ousley family graciously donated 40 lbs. of ground beef for this barbeque. Christine and

Tricia will shop for supplies and coordinate with Beth Meyers to finalize details. Steve Hotsenpiller will provide the grill for this event and he and Kevin Dusheke will handle the barbequing. Mr. & Mrs. Ahlers have donated their time to patty all the hamburgers before this event. All parents have been asked to bring a side dish based on the grade of their student.

The Heit's Point Retreat for grades 9 & 10 will take place on Aug. 11 – 13 so mark your calendars.

Installation of 2 new teachers at Calvary to teach English and Science will take place on August 17th. The destination will be announced at a later date.

Mr. Ahlers indicated a couple Beginning of Year Welcome's are needed for students and families to get to know each other. Terri Peters and the student council would like to organize an event at Memorial Pool and Mr. Ahlers and others suggested having another event after the first week of school for everyone. Christine Hollingsworth indicated the new Executive Committee will work on getting an event organized. Mr. Ahlers stated he would coordinate with our coaches to not schedule practices on these scheduled days once they are planned.

A work day is scheduled for May 31st at Calvary to expand farther into its current facility. This will include heavy lifting to take down walls and reconstruct walls. Please contact Mr. Ahlers if you would be able to help out.

A tentative paint day was set for Saturday, August 2nd to help clean and paint different areas of the school.

Mr. Ahlers indicated Calvary has sent out flyers to Trinity and Honey Creek for 2 sports camps taking place for 3,4,5th & 6,7,8th grades. One camp over basketball will be held from June 30 - July 3. The other volleyball camp will take place July 7 – 10th. The Calvary coaches and individual players will hold this event. The cost of the camp along with a t-shirt will cost \$25.

Mr. Engelbrecht spoke about the 16 informational meetings Calvary has almost completed for the public. There are 2 more informative meeting on Monday, May 19th at 9 am & 6:30 pm @ Calvary. Several members from the community have attended these meeting and expressed an interest in the school's financial future.

Mr. Engelbrecht indicated the land for the new school can be purchased on June 2nd if the \$300,000 has been raised by the capital campaign. We are a long way off at this point and may have to back up this date but Mr. Engelbrecht stated if anyone knows of a business or individual they could talk to about donations for this purchase to please talk to them or let him know. He stated we could be in the school within 15 months from the time this amount is raised.

Office equipment for the part of Calvary we will need to extend into is needed. If anyone works for a business that has any tables, chairs, desks or other items we could use please contact Mr. Engelbrecht at the school.
