RESCUE STORY - A devotion from Mr. Christman

Perhaps you have watched more movies in the time you have spent from home. A good rescue story is a common plot in tv crime dramas and many movies. A victim is taken hostage by circumstances (Tom Hanks on a remote island) or by a perpetrator (in any movie with Bruce Willis or Liam Neeson). The bulk of the episode or movie is spent pursuing a successful rescue and more often than not, the story resolves happily. Everyone likes a good rescue story.

As we celebrated Easter in a way unlike any before, I was struck this time by the story of Lazarus from John 11. He died while Jesus was ministering in another town. When Christ returned to join His friends in mourning, both Martha, then Mary said to Him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." They knew Jesus had the power to heal and could have restored Lazarus' health. Though they did not know it, healing was not immediately part of God's plan. God can use all things (Romans 8:28) including physical pain and even death to reveal His plot twist – our spiritual health, our ultimate resurrection and an eternal abiding with our Savior is His priority. This is the chapter of the bible that we hear Christ's words, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die."

I think most memorable movies and tv shows have characters with which we can identify. Read John 11. Who are you in that story? Whose perspective matches your own most closely right now? Martha or Mary? The disciples or the Pharisees? Or Lazarus? This Easter, I find myself identifying with Lazarus most. I am dead in my sins. I have no control over so many things of this life, one I sometimes dare to call my own. And yet, I have hope because I have a rescuer. In His resurrection, Christ called me out from the tomb. He is our rescue story. May God grant you the joy, the comfort, the peace and the faith to rest in this Truth. His story is our story.
